Leyton Sixth Form College is on Essex Road, postcode London E10 6EQ (car park; buses W15 and W19 to Essex Road South; or buses along Lea Bridge Road W15, W16, W19, 20, 56, 230, 257 and 357 eastwards to the stop for Leyton Green Road, or the same routes westwards along Lea Bridge Road to the Essex Road stop)
